The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012

In accordance with Part 2 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012, Lancaster City Council and Wyre Council recently consulted on an application made by Ellel Parish Council and Nether Wyresdale Parish Council for the designation of Dolphinholme Area as a Neighbourhood Area for the purposes of Neighbourhood Planning. Following consultation, Lancaster City Council and Wyre Council have resolved (on 24 January 2017) to approve the application and designate the area of Dolphinholme as a Neighbourhood Area.

In accordance with the above regulations, in particular Regulation 7(1) both councils must publicise the following information about the designation to bring it to the attention of people who live, work or carry on business in the area to which the designation relates.

Name of the Neighbourhood Area

The name of the Neighbourhood Area is the Dolphinholme Neighbourhood Area.
