Amendments have been made to update policy DM53 to positively highlight opportunities for wind energy across the Lancaster District and to identify them as areas suitable for wind energy (where a proposal can be positively assessed against policy DM53), as set out on pages 145 to 155 of the Climate Emergency Review of the Development Management DPD. The map on page 155 of the DPD identifies the constraints that have been used to inform the opportunity areas.

Amendments have also been made to policy SC4 to identify a number of key Green and Blue Corridors and Chains (previously known as Green Space Networks), informed by the Green and Blue Infrastructure Strategy, and the list of corridors and chains (including those which have been added or revised) can be found within the policy itself on pages 181 to 183 of the Climate Emergency Review of the Strategic Policies and Land Allocations DPD. The purpose of policy SC4 is to provide a spatial indication and recognition of the key strategic green and blue corridors and chains within our district, as opposed to a fixed, bounded designation.
