

Top tips for household recycling

Wash your recyclables in leftover dishwater - containers contaminated with dirty jars, cans and food containers can attract insects and vermin.

Containers contaminated with nonrecyclable items such as used nappies, tissues and kitchen paper can mean a whole day's collection being rejected and going to landfill and all your hard work going to waste.

Squashing your recyclables wherever possible will mean that there will be more room in both your containers and our collection wagons to hold and recycle more.

Make sure your containers are out for collection by 7am on collection day to ensure they're not missed. If you have a wheelie bin for your recyclables, you do not need to put it out if it's not full.

Unwanted items which we're currently not collecting such as small electricals can be dropped off at local recycling **points**. Enter your postcode at recyclenow.com/recycle-an-item to find your nearest. You can also donate items to registered charities and re-use organisations such as Freegle.
