Page 80	<b>Part 3, Section 1 para 1 (k)</b>	To change from “Appoint to the Council’s Veterans Champions Role” to “Appoint to the Armed Forces Champion and Disability Champions roles should the post(s) be vacant.”	Monitoring Officer. The title of the Veterans’ Champion role was changed to Armed Forces champion by Council in July 2022. All Champion

			appointments are for four years from election to election. The change reflects both these points.
Pages 270 to 274.	<b>Part 5, Councillors Allowances Scheme</b>	Replace the old rates of allowances and the carers allowances rates with the new rates agreed by Council on 11 December 2024.	Council agreed in December 2024.
Page 270	<b>Part 5, Councillors Allowances Scheme</b>	Remove para 2.4  2.4 In order to comply with the requirements of Data Protection legislation, the Council pay for the registration of each Councillor under the Data Protection Act.	Monitoring Officer textual change. Councillors are no longer required to pay a fee.
Page 271	<b>Part 5 Paras 5 and 6</b>	Remove both paras as they refer to suspension of Cllrs for breaches of the Code of Conduct under previous legislation. There is no power to suspend under the current standards regime. The power to suspend councillors for such breaches was removed by the Localism Act 2011. Renumbering of subsequent paras.	Monitoring Officer textual change in view of change in legislation.
